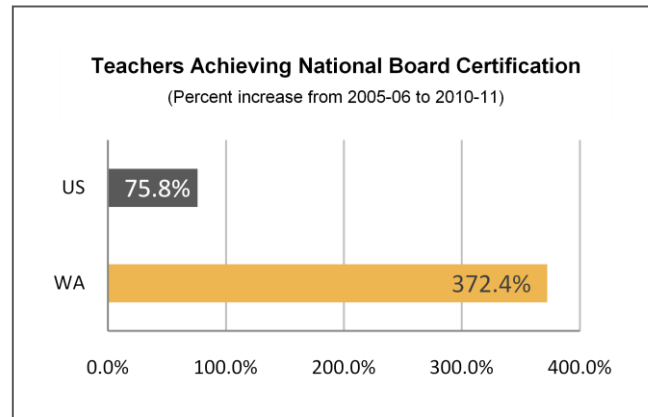


America's partner in growing great schools - 2011 Statistics for Washington

In 2011, 6,266 teachers became National Board Certified Teachers (NBCTs) through NBPTS, bringing the total number of NBCTs nationwide to 97,291.

These accomplished teachers comprise approximately 3 percent of the national teaching force - more than half teach in high-need schools and 15 percent are certified in STEM-related areas. This year, 19 states had at least a 10 percent increase in the number of teachers earning certification over the prior year. Nineteen states have more than doubled the number of NBCTs in the past five years. In Washington and Wyoming, NBCT populations have more than quadrupled in the past five years. Research shows that students taught by Board Certified teachers consistently see the highest gains in achievement.
